No doubt you have noticed this action on your farm. Near the lower part of the ditch a small water fall starts. Year by year it with Dan Anderson, and Walter eats back into valuable farm land and is 20 to 30 feet deep and from 60 to 100 feet wide. The amount of water passing over the overfall may not be great but the damage done may be considerable. Sometimes a second overfall starts below the first one and a merry procession

Oftentimes checking the first one will also way-lay the others. There are several methods used and while they are more or less temporary wil give considerable relief. One system to construct a large apron of woven wire and brush which is staked down after the overfall has been shoveled off so it is more of a slide than : direct drop. In many cases a plank chute has been used effectively to conduct water from the higher level to the lower one, although galvanized sheet iron could be used for the same purpose.
