Bina Cook, the eldest of twelve, the daughter of Joseph and Mary Cook, was born at Dayton, Ohio, on February 20, 1850, and passed to her reward after a lingering sickness at the home of her daughter, Mrs. E. M. Stone, at 3 a. m., December 9th, 1929, aged 79 years, 9 months and 19 days.

At the age of eight years, she came with her parents in a covered wagon and settled near Plattsmouth. The hardships and privations of pioneer life were a reality and no doubt played some part in the development of the helpful and kindly spirit with which she was endowed throughout her entire life.
