TO VISIT NORTHWEST

Mrs. A. D. Asch of Murray, is planning to see the scenic wonders of the Pacific Northwest and the Canadian Rockies this summer as a member of the third annual Cornhusker Vacation Tour to that section. Instead of the torrid heat of mid-August she will enjoy the cool breezes of mountain altitudes and seashore climates, en route on this two weeks' trip over 6,000 miles in length.

This will be the third farm vacation tour of Nebraska people and their friends to that section of the country. On the preceding tours more than 400 people, traveling in all-Pullman, special trains, with observation and dining cars attached, took the trip, enjoying every convenience and luxury of first-class travel, and returned with enthusiastic over the good time they had, the scenery they saw and the interesting places they had visited.

The Cornhusker Special of 1931 leaves Omaha on August 9 and passes through the Twin Cities, Duluth, Winnipeg, Saskatoon, Jasper Park, Vancouver, Victoria, Seattle, Longview, Portland, Spokane and Glacier National Park. Suitable stops will be made at all places of interest to permit plenty of time for sight-seeing.

Among the high spots of the trip will be Duluth at the headwaters of the Great Lakes, Wainwright Buffalo Park, Jasper Park in the heart of the Canadian Rockies, Vancouver, the boat trip on a big ocean steamship from Vancouver to Seattle, Portland, Longview, the Cascade Tunnel and Glacier National Park.
