DEATH OF MRS. ZITKA

Last evening Mrs. Frances Zitka, who has been seriously ill for the past week from flu and pneumonia, died at the home on North Ninth street at the age of seventy-eight years.

The deceased lady had been a resident of this city for the past forty-two years and had a large circle of friends who will regret to learn of her passing.

Frances Kasper was born in Bohemia, April 15, 1854, growing to womanhood in that country and where she was married to Joseph Hula. There were eight children born to Mr. and Mrs. Hula, five of whom preceded the parents in death. The surviving children are Charles W. and Anton Hula of this city and Michael Hula of Louisville. The husband died a number of years ago and Mrs. Hula was married the

second time to John Zitka, who also preceded her in death.

DEMAND FREIGHT RATE CUT

Pittsburgh. — Pittsburgh and Youngstown steel companies threatened rail carriers with "immediate" relocation of their plants to the Detroit area unless relief in freight rates is granted. "We cannot permanently pay \$5.70 a ton to deliver steel into Detroit," J. A. Coakley, general traffic manager of the United States Steel corporation subsidiaries, told representatives of three freight associations at a public hearing.

"I will say frankly, unless our demands for reductions to compete with water rates to the automobile district are granted we are prepared to change our factories to the source of the demand," Coakley said. The petition of the United States Steel companies, which was supported by independents of the Youngstown, O., and Pittsburgh areas, demanded reductions ranging from 4 cents to as high as 15 1-2 cents per hundred pounds.

Roosevelt Says No Offers Made Yet for Cabinet

E. T. Rector of Omaha Among Visitors to President-elect—
McAdoo Sunday.

New York, Jan. 12.—All cabinet speculation was ruled out of order today by President-elect Roosevelt with the statement that he has made no offer and probably would make none until next month.

Turning from a series of conferences revolving principally about the farm relief problem, the president-elect, in a meeting with newspaper men brushed aside the cabinet speculation, adding that it would be guess work now even on his own part to write on the make-up of the official family.

It also was made very emphatic that Mr. Roosevelt intends to know very well and talk with those he invites to sit about the council table with him.

Only one person is regarded here as a certainty in the Roosevelt cabinet—James A. Farley of New York, chairman of the democratic national committee. He is slated for post-master general.

Talks with Woodring.
Harry H. Woodring, who just retired as governor of Kansas, led off the farm discussions today at the Roosevelt home. Silent about the "party plan" agriculture measure in congress, Woodring said immediate action is necessary to increase farm and commodity prices to "meet the economic crisis."

A delegation representing the American Association of Creamery Butter Manufacturers, headed by W. F. Jensen of Chicago, urged revenue legislation on products in which foreign oils and fats are used as a means of stopping these importations. The group also protested the inclusion of dairy products in the house farm bill and asked that the legislation be confined to wheat and cotton alone.

Sees McAdoo Sunday.
Today's Roosevelt conferences were concluded by a call from Senator Lewis (dem., Ill.), a member of the foreign relations committee. William G. McAdoo, senator-elect from California, will visit the president-elect at his Hyde Park home Sunday night.

A delegation representing the National Grange is on tomorrow's calling list. The delegation of creamery butter manufacturers included Edgar T. Rector of Omaha.

Other callers included General Taufflieb, a member of the French senate. The latter call was described as "purely social."—World-Herald.
