Auto and Truck License Measures Now in Effect

Governor Bryan Signs Neubauer and Stringfellow Bills This Morning—\$3 and \$5 for Cars

Governor Bryan this morning attached his signature to both the Neubauer auto license and Stringfellow truck license bills. As each carries the emergency clause, they become effective immediately.

Under the terms of the auto license measure, all cars under 2,800 pounds list weight will be licensed for \$3 per year, while heavier passenger cars will cost \$5 per year.

The old rates were \$8 and \$12, with the weight classification dividing on 2,700 pounds. Owners of cars who have secured their plates at the old rate are entitled to a rebate of the difference, to-wit: \$5 on cars of under 2,700 pounds weight, \$7 on cars over 2,800 pounds weight, and \$9 on cars of between 2,700 and 2,800 pounds weight.

The line forms at the right, gentlemen, so step right up and pass your \$3 or \$5, as the case may be, across the window at the county treasurer's office and get your bright new orange colored license plates.

As the time for securing plates is now long overdue, only a short grace period will be allowed.
