### PRESSURE FOR JOES STRONG

Washington.—Democrats, Postmaster General Farley believes, "can ride horses as well as republicans." He said so in telling newspapermen that federal employees who have been "unfairly blanketed in the civil service should be removed." Among those he said he had in mind were some 200 men riding the border in Texas to prevent the smuggling of aliens into this country and who were given civil service status by President Hoover.

Farley also said he would present to President Roosevelt when the latter returns from his vacation the views expressed by Representative McClintic, Okl., namely, that employees "blanketed in" by past republican administrators should be removed from the civil service protection. McClintic discussed the patronage situation with the postmaster general. The Oklahoman headed a special house committee which was created by dissatisfied democrats to hurry up the distribution of patronage. This committee has fixed its eyes on the 500 jobs in the library of congress which are not under civil service.

Farley told McClintic that the library is a part of the legislative establishment and that removal of republicans from positions there was a matter for democratic members of congress to settle.

High officials are seriously considering a move to open thousands of jobs now under civil service for appointment by the democratic administration and this probably will be one of the first proposals placed before Mr. Roosevelt when he gets back to Washington.

## Railway Chiefs and Labor Come into Agreement

Conferees Decide to Continue the 10 Percent Cut in Wages That Is Now In Effect.

Washington.—An agreement was signed by representatives of railroad executives and railroad labor leaders settling upon a 10 percent wage reduction to be effective until June 30, 1934. The agreement was signed in the office of Joseph E. Eastman, federal railroad co-ordinator.

In return for the extension of the 10 percent cut now in effect the railroad management agreed to withdraw a demand for an additional 12 1-2 percent reduction in the basic rates of pay.

Eastman's announcement said: "The railroad managers and the railroad labor executives have entered into an agreement under which the arrangement by which 10 percent is being deducted from the pay checks of employees will be extended from Oct. 31, 1933, until June 30, 1934.

and under which the date on which either party can submit a notice in accordance with the provisions of the railway labor act indicating a desire to change the basic rates of pay will be extended from June 25, 1933, to Feb. 15, 1934.

"Under this agreement the railroads will surrender for a period of eight months their right to seek a further reduction in employees' compensation and the employees will surrender for an equal period of time their opportunity to secure an elimination of the present 10 percent reduction. The notice given by the railroads on June 15 of an intention to seek a 22 1-2 percent reduction in the basic rates of pay will be cancelled.

"This agreement has been reached because both the railroads and the employees wish to do nothing which would in any way embarrass or threaten the present policy of the administration. They realize that the government has now embarked upon a wholly new policy designed to promote business and industrial activity and to further the general welfare.

"They appreciate that until the results of this policy can be more clearly determined it will be difficult to deal wisely with this wage contro-

versy and that the active prosecution of such a controversy at the present time might have a most disturbing and unsettling effect."—State Journal.

### FOREIGN TRADE BANK

New York.—Directors of the American Manufacturers' Export asso-

ciation authorized the appointment of a committee to organize a central bank for foreign trade under the federal reserve act. The bank's primary function, it was announced, will be to assist in liquidating frozen funds and to supplement the existing banking facilities thru the granting of longer term credits than are now available.
