Flays False NRA Critics

Acting Director of Nebraska NRA Sees Political Aim of Its Truducers.

Vigorous condemnation of "misleading statements being made for political purposes" by enemies of the new deal regarding work of the NRA organization in Nebraska was voiced Tuesday in a formal statement by H. T. Williamson, acting state director for NRA. In his statement, which bears the title "Truth of the Matter," Mr. Williamson brands the statements as entirely false. The statement follows:

"Certain misleading statements are being made for political purposes at the present time purporting to show that the NRA organization of Nebraska is arbitrarily levying fines upon employers without giving the said employers an opportunity to present their sides of the cases. These statements are entirely false. Every Right Protected.

"Such alleged violations of the codes of fair competition and the president's re-employment agreement must be supported by reasonable evidence, and thereafter they are carefully investigated in a fair, judicial and friendly fashion. Every employer against whom a complaint has been made is given opportunity to meet the allegations of the complaining parties. If, after thorough investigation, it appears that the employer has violated his agreement with the president, the matter is handled in a manner according to law, equity and good conscience.

"The rules and regulations of the state compliance director's office contain nothing to deprive an employer of every right and privilege which he has under the NIRA and the administrative orders made pursuant thereto. Provisions are contained in the NRA regulations for appeals. The method is inexpensive and simple. No fines are being levied by the state compliance office, nor will any such fines be levied. The proceeds of any settlement made, after the investigation referred to above, are paid over to the employees affected, and constitute wages justly due these employees, and no part thereof is retained by the government.

"Our attention has been called to several instances which have been given misleading publicity by the opponents of NRA. We have examined very carefully each of these cases, and have found in every instance that only one side of those

cases had been presented to the public. We have also found that these complaints of unfairness did not originate with the employers in question, but were searched out and enlarged upon by those wishing to use them for political gain.

"As everybody knows, there are always two sides to every question. If the critics of NRA had exercised the same fairness that the NRA organization does, and carefully investigated the sad instances from both sides before passing judgment, they would have found that these cases were handled in a judicious and fair manner. They would have found that the payment of back wages was fully justified.

"It is apparent that, in any competitive trade or industry, those employers who conscientiously comply with wage and hour provisions of codes of fair competition—such provisions merely establishing minimum requirements—are grossly discriminated against by those employers who do not so comply. This statement is equally applicable to the other provisions of the codes of fair competition.

"In conclusion, it is both necessary and proper to say that those critics who utilize the press, the platform and the curbstone to criticize officers of the government who are earnestly and advisedly undertaking to secure compliance with a law regularly enacted by congress designed to lift business out of its

severely depressed condition and to confer upon the average American citizen a modicum of security and happiness, are rendering the enforcement of this law more and more difficult. We look and listen in vain to this criticism for some positive plan to attain the objective of the NIRA."
