Old Age Pension Board of County to Hold Meeting

Will Sit With Board of County Commissioners, Thursday, Dec. 6—Many Applications.

W. M. Barclay of this city, chairman of the old age pension commission announces that a meeting of the commission will be held with the board of county commissioners on Thursday, December 6th.

The commission which covers all parts of the county has a new member, Charles T. Edwards of Elmwood, appointed to succeed the late Edward Carr.

The applications for this fund are being made to the various members of the commission in the different sections of the county and Mr. Barclay already has received 116 in his district and others in different sections also have had many applications.

The county is divided in districts as follows, with the members to whom the applications should be made:

W. M. Barclay—Plattsmouth City and precinct, East Rock Bluffs, Eight Mile Grove.

L. G. Todd—Liberty, Nehawka, West Rock Bluffs, Avoca.

George Bucknell—Elmwood, South Bend, Salt Creek.

C. T. Edwards—Tipton, Stone Creek, Greenwood.

Frank Woods—Weeping Water city and precinct, Center, Louisville and Mt. Pleasant.

The commission organized with Mr. Barclay as the chairman and Mr. Woods as the secretary. Those who contemplate making applications should do so as soon as possible before the commission meets to pass on the applications.

The head tax of fifty cents which is levied on each person in the county to provide the funds for the old age pension, has not produced the revenue that it had been hoped and the payments will be very small to the persons placed on the pension roll.

In Iowa the tax is \$2 a person and produces funds that make the payments something near adequate for the aged to live upon and the present law in this state will probably be amended by the coming session of the legislature to increase the amount or provide other means of procuring the funds.

STORE IS ROBBED

The variety store at Weeping Water, operated by A. G. Michelson, was robbed some time Friday night, messages received here at the office of Sheriff Homer Sylvester stated.

The robbery was discovered this morning when the time for opening the store arrived and an investigation was at once started by the Weeping Water marshal, Sheriff Sylvester and Deputy Sheriff Thomas Walling were at Weeping Water this afternoon to assist in the effort to solve the case.

PLAINTIFF SECURES JUDGMENT

The jury in the case of Alden A. Barden vs. Herman W. Boller, et al., Thursday afternoon returned a verdict and judgment for \$300 in favor of the plaintiff in the case. The action was a dispute over the matter of plowing and planting farm land and the disagreement as to the price to be paid for the same.

Judge Livingston excused the members of the jury panel until Monday when they will return to start on the large number of cases that are awaiting them.
