Final Check of Corn-Hog Compliance.

Corn-hog contract signers will make their final statements of compliance in Nebraska beginning December 3rd.

Practically all the men employed as supervisors in August and September will be used again in an attempt to get the field work done in a hurry.

The 1934 corn-hog contract year ends at midnight, November 30. Compliance blanks and other materials to be used by the supervisors were received in the county office this week.

Proof of compliance at this time will entitle the contract signers to their final payment of \$2.00 per head on their hogs.

Community committeemen and the allotment committee of the county corn-hog association will approve the statements obtained by the supervisors on the farms.

Halbert purchased the car only Wednesday night. About 5:30 p. m., two men came to his cab stand and told him they wanted to go to a house in the eastern part of Falls City.

About two blocks from the cab stand the men both displayed revolvers and one said to Halbert, "We are not going to hurt you. We just want to use you and your car."

A few minutes later the smaller gunman who was 34 or 35 years old, climbed into the front seat of the car with Halbert and the larger robber, who was said by the cab owner to be 38 or 40 years old, remained in the rear seat.
