Final Check of Corn-Hog Compliance.

Corn-hog contract signers will make their final statements of compliance in Nebraska beginning December 3rd. Local men employed as supervisors by the county corn-hog association will visit the farms, count up the hogs left on them, and help the signers fill out the records needed to finish the official compliance blanks in the county office.

Practically all the men employed as supervisors in August and September will be used again in an attempt to get the field work done in a hurry. If the farm visits can be completed while the weather and the roads are good, much time and expense can be saved the members of th eassociation.
