Sale of Iowa Land Planned to Individuals

Twelve Per Cent of State's Total Acreage Now Is in Hands of Corporations.

Ames, Dec. 11 .- The transfer of Iowa's corporate owned land back into the hands of individual farm opcrators stands as one of the biggest problems in Iowa's land planning program, believes Dr. W. G. Murray, agricultural economist at Iowa State

Until such a time as the majority of the present land holdings of corporations are sold, this group of farms will hang over the land market like a cloud, Dr. Murray told the state planning board.
