
# Northwestern Defeats Notre Dame, 14 to 7

## New Gasoline Inspection System is Established

Director W. B. Banning of Department of Agriculture and Inspection Makes Announcement.

In order to serve gasoline dealers spection of gasoline and other liquid fuels, is now being established in Ne-

This new inspection system relished at various terminal points throughout the state. The chief and complete laboratory will remain in the state capitol at Lincoln. The first sub-laboratories were established last week in Omaha, Superior and Scottsbluff. Two others will be opened within the next few days at Norfolk

Several other points will be announced later, just as soon as it is possible to obtain the equipment and make the necessary arrangements. Nebraska's ports of entry will be used in perfecting this new inspec-

This new inspection set-up will be so arranged that liquid fuels entering the state can be inspected upon their arrival, as well as liquid fuels oming from dealers' tanks or pumps. This will afford an opportunity for inspections before the dealer unloads the fuel, and also after he has placed it on the market for sale to the gen-

General inspectors will continue to ake samples from dealers' pumps and bulk stations. These samples will be sent to the nearest laboratory, thus insuring quick service. Any dealer who might wish a special inspection service, can contact the laboratory p.
