### Stomach Disorder Sweeping Milwaukee

Two Deaths Are Reported and 120,000 Persons Have Suffered From the Epidemic.

Milwaukee.—An epidemic of stomach disorders that has caused two deaths and attacked an estimated 120,000 persons was described by health officials as having struck its high point.

"We have had outbreaks similar to this before, but never so widespread," Dr. John P. Koehler, health commissioner, said. "I think the peak has been reached and the case load will diminish rapidly."

The second death attributed to the disease that has been reported to authorities was that of Henry Zjbel, 48, who had complained of illness early Sunday and was stricken Monday aboard the steamer Nevada on which he was working.

The term "intestinal influenza" by which the malady has become known locally is not truly descriptive, Dr. Koehler said, but is used only for lack of a better one.

While urging residents to continue to boil drinking water, Dr. Koehler and Henry Hoh . . . Henry P. Bohmann, superintendent of the water department, said water was not causing the wave of illness.

### TRAFFIC DEATHS DECLINE

Chicago.—The biggest reduction in traffic accident deaths in five years was reported for February by the national safety council. Thirteen percent fewer lives were lost on the nation's highways during the month than in February, 1935, but the toll

remained high—1,950.

The sharp February drop, greatest for any month since 1931, showed the new year's first results of the safety council's campaign to cut motor deaths 35 percent in five years. Counteracting January's increase, the figure for last month brought 1936 3 percent under the corresponding total for 1935. Perfect ratings on a population basis were hung up by Omaha, Altoona, Pa.; Bay City, Mich., and Wausau, Wis.

### BYPASS CAUSES 2 DEATHS

Omaha.—James Tarascio, 45, and his wife, 30, were found dead of gas in their north Omaha home by police summoned when passing boys smelled the gas. Two cruiser policemen found Mrs. Tarascio lying on the living room floor and her husband slumped over the gas meter in the basement. The officers said Tarascio ran a bypass around the meter to obtain gas for a furnace heater and apparently was trying to plug a leak in the bypass when overcome. His wife apparently smelled the leaking gas and tried to escape from the house.

### ACCUSED OF KILLING WIFE

Hazelton, Pa.—A former Hazelton high school teacher was held in the county jail facing a charge of murder after he was alleged to have confessed hacking his wife to death with an axe. The murder charge was lodged against Ernest Cook, 45, after a post mortem showed his wife, first believed to have been the victim of an accident, had been struck on the head. Mrs. Cook was slain in the cellar of her home while their daughter was upstairs. It was originally believed she was struck as she walked behind her husband while he was chopping wood.
