

Routine Business at the March Board Meetings

Designates Papers to Publish Election Notice—Selects 80 Names from which to Draw Jury.

Routine business took up much of the time of the County Commissioners at their March meetings held on the 3rd, 4th and 5th, including the allowance of claims filed against the county for services and materials.

At its session the 3rd, the Board approved renewal Mothers' Pension orders for Mrs. Ida N. Cotner, Mrs. Marcia Hise, Mrs. Florence J. Brittain and Mrs. Anna Pittman.

The appointment of Alfred Gansmer as precinct assessor of West Rock Bluffs and W. A. Wheeler as precinct assessor for East Rock Bluffs, to fill the unexpired term of Sam F. Latta, deceased, was approved.

The Board designated the Plattsmouth Journal, Louisville Courier, Elmwood Leader-Echo, Nehawka Enterprise, Weeping Water Republican and the Eagle Beacon as papers to publish the official "Notice of 1936 Primary Election."

At its session of March 4, the Board adopted a resolution permitting the withdrawal of securities by Nebraska State Bank, Weeping Water, and reducing accordingly the maximum amount of deposit to be carried in said depository.

At its session of the 5th, the Board selected a list of eighty names from which to draw the jury for the April term of the District Court.

Clarkias and Godetias Thrive in Poor Soil

Fine Coloring and Satiny Texture Make Them Excellent Cutting Material.

Two brilliant annuals not so often grown but deserving of wide popularity in the garden are the clarkias and godetias. They are both members of the evening primrose family and have the satiny texture to their bloom that is so characteristic of the many plants of this tribe.

Unlike most other growing plants, they do their best on a poor soil, and if planted in rich loam, or a bed which has been recently fertilized they become lazy and fail to give their best bloom.

The clarkias have been taken up by the greenhouse men and are now popular for winter cut flowers, but they are just as handsome in the garden and very easily grown there.

The double varieties are best for cutting. They range in color from white through light and deep pink to orange scarlet.

The godetias have large blooms of more brilliant coloring, and often have splashes of color on light backgrounds to make them more striking in appearance.

The gladiolus-kowered forms, which come from England, are improvements on an old double form named Malmalson, a favorite for cutting because of its fine spikes of double bluish flowers with scarlet centers.
