New Football Season Reveals Changes In Many University Coaching Staffs

Nation-Wide Survey Shows That More Than 100 Schools in U. S. Have Shifted Gridiron Mentors This Year

A nation-wide survey reveals that 100 colleges and universities have changed coaches this year. Most of the changes in coaching personnel are in smaller colleges, but several of the larger schools have new appointees. The University of Wisconsin, in the doldrums for some time, has ousted Dr. Clarence W. Spears and in his place has named Harry Stuhldreher, for seven years a successful coach at Villanova. Spears hooked up with the University of Toledo. Tulane Has New Coach. Cornell, going through a bad season, has changed coaches, the veteran Gil Dobie being replaced by Carl Snavely, mentor of the North Carolina team. Dobie now is at Boston College. Snavely's place at North Carolina has been taken by Ray (Bear) Wolf. Other Changes Reported. Judge Walter P. Steffen of Chicago returns to his old post as advisory coach at Carnegie Tech. Vic Hurt took "Gloomy Gus" Henderson's post at Oklahoma A. & M. Bob Neyland returned to his former post at Tennessee after a year's absence, replacing his former assistant, Bill Britton. Clipper Smith quit Santa Clara to replace Stuhldreher at Villanova. Lawrence (Buck) Shaw, assistant to Smith, is now head coach at Santa Clara. Ernie Nevers is new coach at Lafayette, the former Stanford All-American replacing Herb McCracken. Josh Cody, last year an assistant at Vanderbilt, went to the University of Florida to take the place of Dutch Stanley. Frank Debuson, former University of Richmond coach, is new head mentor at University of Maryland. John P. Smith is successor to Christy Flanagan at Duquesne. Among other new coaches are Tom Conley at John Carroll university, Wilbur White at Colorado Mines, Guy Lookbaugh at Grinnell, John Levi at Massachusetts State, Alvin Julian at Muhlenberg, Monk Simmons at Transylvania, Jimmy Aiken at Akron, Elmer Salm at Washburn, Wendell Smith at Wheaton, Branch Boeck at William-Mary and Clem Crowe at Xavier.
