Sixty-six baby beeves are being fed by Cass county 4-H club members this year. 2A special feed ration for these calves has been worked out by the agent, and is being mixed by the Allied Mills of Omaha. This complete ration is costing the boys a little less than corn and cottonseed meal which is the usual feed. This spirit of cooperation on the part of the Allied Mills will do much to help these 4-H members through a year made difficult because of the feed situation.
