

Commissioners Encourage Road to Dock Site

Vote \$4,398.38 at December Meeting Toward Extending Main Street to the Missouri River.

Among the official actions taken by the County Commissioners at their December meetings, was the passing of a resolution on December 3, agreeing to furnish from the funds of Cass county toward the securing of a road from the foot of Main street to the Missouri river dock site...

A number of months ago, the Commissioners passed a similar resolution pledging money for incidental costs of construction of the dock itself, another proposed WPA project...

Approved appointment by Charles L. Graves, Justice of Peace of Plattsburgh City and A. H. Duxbury, County Judge, of John M. Meisinger as constable in Cass county for a term of two years, effective January 7, 1937.

Approved official bonds of a large number of, elective officers—county and precinct, and order same placed on file.

Considered three bids for burial of county cases, accepting the bid of Streight & Streight, which included: Caskets, \$5.50 per foot; trip to cemetery, \$7.50; extra trip, \$7.50; rough box, \$1.00; shroud, \$6.00; extra for floater, \$10.00. Other bidders included Sattler Funeral Home and Horton Funeral Home.

Considered two bids for publishing the official proceedings of the Board during 1937, accepting bid of Weeping Water Republican at one cent per line.
