N. D. Talcott, of Greenwood, Roll Call Director for Cass County in the recent Red Cross membership drive, submits the following report to the Journal for publication:

"Due to the general depression and failure of farm crops, I anticipated that the drive for memberships in 1936 would fall considerably from previous years. However, I am happy to say that we not only came up to the 1935 drive but did even better. In 1935 we obtained 530 members and in 1936 743 members, which is quite a gain and very gratifying to the officers and solicitors.

Right now they are having disastrous floods in the east and I am sure that the Red Cross is on hand to care for the unfortunate, if there be some.
