

County Board Busy During the Past Month

Reorganization and Other Duties Require Attention—Adopt Annual Estimate Expense

The Board of County Commissioners transacted much business at their January meetings, including reorganization for the year, with one new member on the board, the settling of policies, determination of salaries to be paid for various types of work during the coming year, and approval of various requests for funds by such organizations as the county fair and county Farm Bureau, finally adopting the annual estimate of expense. Some of these matters have been given publicity in the Journal heretofore and they will be reviewed but briefly here.

At the meeting of January 5th, reports were received from the following county offices of fees collected during the fourth quarter of 1936:

An order by the County Judge to increase the Mother's Pension of Mrs. Anna Pittman for the months of January and February was approved.

A resolution was passed canceling the bond of W. G. Kieck as county attorney.

On January 6th a long list of official bonds of various precinct and township officers were approved and ordered placed on file.

On January 7, the new board met with George L. Farley as the incoming member to succeed Julius A. Pitz. In the re-organization, E. B. Chapman was named as chairman, Mr. Farley as vice chairman and Fred H. Gorder as junior member.

Order by County Judge renewing Mother's Pension of Mrs. Lucille Gaines was approved.

A resolution was passed approving substitution of bank securities in an equal amount by the Nebraska State Bank of Weeping Water.

At the next meeting of the Board on January 12, much business in addition to the allowance of claim bills was transacted.

Order by County Judge renewing Mother's Pension of Mrs. Elsie M. Smith was approved.

County Judge A. H. Duxbury filed his appointment of Minnie Hild as Clerk of the County Court, together with recommendation that her salary be fixed as provided by statute. The Board approved the appointment and fixed the salary at \$1,080 per year.

The Cass County Agricultural Society filed its annual report for 1936, showing total receipts of \$3,928.65, and total expenditures of \$2,628.31, with a cash balance of \$1,300.34 and real estate and equipment valued at \$5,605.86 at the beginning of the new year. The society also filed its request for the sum of \$2,000.00 to finance the county fair during the year 1937, which request was approved by the Board, as provided by law.

The Cass County Farm Bureau also filed its report with statement of total expenditures for year 1936, totaling \$2,809.00, together with a report of the work accomplished during the year, and a request for an allowance of \$2,800.00 the coming year, which the Board approved as provided by 1933 Session Laws of Nebraska.

Raymond J. Larson, of Plattsmouth, was appointed as a member of the Soldiers Relief Commission for a term of one year, and Ben A. Olive, of Weeping Water as a member for the three-year term ending in 1940.

Dr. J. W. Brendel of Avoca was appointed county Medical Advisor for the year 1937.

Quit claim deed was signed by the Board conveying some nine lots located in Weeping Water City to H. E. Myers.

Prices for road and drag work for the year 1937 were fixed as follows: Road Overseer, per hour, single hand, 30c; with team, 45c. Man, single hand, per hour, 20c. Man with team, per hour, 35c. Price for team, per hour, 15c. For drag, 10 foot, or over, round trip, per mile, 55c; 8 foot drag, per mile, 50c.
