DENY ESPIONAGE CHARGE

VATICAN CITY, Aug. 6 (UP)—Officials of the Holy See smiled when informed of the Ivestia's charges of espionage by the Russian college in Rome, "Russicum."

They emphatically denied that the college in any way was connected with espionage activities, but admitted that it was a vital center of anti-bolshevist propaganda and one of its fondest hopes was to return to Russia and restore Christianity.
