LINCOLN, Feb. 2 (UP)-Charles J. Warner of Waverly, veteran legis-

braska unicameral legislature filed expert was ready to leave Moscow to- C. E. Morris was a visitor in Om- much. at 11 a.m. today as a republican candidate for governor.

He was the first to enter the race for the gubernatorial post now held by Governor Cochran, a democrat who completes his second term next January. Governor Cochran has given no hint of his future plans.

Warner made a personal filing at the secretary of state's office. He has served three terms as a representative and 10 as a state senator. He has been a member of the senate continuously since 1919.

In a statement announcing his candidacy Warner said he favored continuation of the state's pay-asyou-go policy, avoidance of new forms of taxation and resistance to federal domination of state agencies.

Warner is 62 and of Swedish extraction. He is a graduate of the University of Nebraska and attended the law school at Washington, D. C.
