There was a large and very en- Second Largest Wheat Crop on Record Hurries Plans for Wheat Loans and Acreage Reduction.

> WASHINGTON, May 11 (UP)-An agricultural department estimate of the second largest winter wheat crop on record today spurred plans for wheat loans and drastic acreage reduction next fall.

The winter wheat estimate of 754.153,000 bushels indicated a total wheat crop of 954,153,000 bushels was possible if the spring wheat crop reaches 200,000,000 bushels which would be normal.
