Village Smithy "ROBBED"

DENNISVILLE, N. J., June 2 (U P)—No poetically spreading chestnut tree shaded Peter Hanke, the village blacksmith, while he worked; he worked indoors; but he buried his savings under a stately willow tree and for four anguished days he thought they were gone.

He reported last Sunday that he had been robbed of every penny he had saved in 20 ears of toil at the anvil, 18 hours a day. He had lost faith in banks during the banking holidays, he said, and had converted his savings into \$1,000 bills. He had six of them and had stuffed them into a tin can and buried them under the willow tree.

Two Cape May county detectives went to investigate with shovels. For four days they dug persistently, ignoring Hanke's suggestions that they had better be out hunting the robber. Yesterday, under two feet of earth, nestled against the willow roots and only six feet from where Hanke had thought he buried his money, they turned up the treasure-laden can.

Hanke has \$6,000 in the bank today.
