

Twenty Years of Extension Work in County

National Organization Started When President Wilson Signed the Smith-Lever Act.

Monday, May 8th marked the 25th anniversary of the inauguration of extension work on a federal basis.

Extension work, was, however, born out of the counties long before that time and grew into state and national prominence.

With the inauguration of the Cass County Farm Bureau in April 1918, an organization working for the interest and advancement of agriculture and farm homemaking in the county, was set up by a group of far-sighted men who realized the need for better cooperation among farmers and the relative need for strong leadership and help with their agricultural problems.

Instrumental in completing the organization were such men as Chas. Noyes, Louisville; Searl Davis, Plattsmouth; W. H. Banning, Union; Bucephalus Wolph, Nehawka; and Raymond Pollard, Nehawka.

This year marks the twentieth birthday of agricultural extension work in Cass county. Throughout these years the efforts of the Farm Bureau have been directed toward two main goals: To help farmers earn more real income; and to help make the farm a better place to live.

In modern agricultural education, there are two essentials. New truths must be discovered. But even the greatest truth is worthless if it lies unused in a dusty file. New facts and old alike must be harnessed into practical, every day work on farms throughout the state.

The Extension Service endeavors to reach children too young to attend college; men and women who have neither the time nor opportunity to attend regular classes, and graduates or former students who are eager to keep abreast of new developments lest their knowledge should grow rusty.
