**Bible School Lesson Study!**

Sunday, May 21st By L. Neitzel, Murdock, Neb.

**"Beverage Alcohol and the Home"**  
Jerem. 35:5-10; Eph. 5:15-21; 6:1-4. (A social aspect of the Liquor problem).

To simplify the study of this lesson, it can best be done to study it under the theme of: Some outstanding characteristics of a truly Christian life, namely: (1) The refusal of the Recheabites to touch wine; (2) The life a Christian should live in evil days, and (3) A picture of an ideal Christian home. The three passages of Scripture will apply.

1—The Recheabites refuse to touch wine. (Jerem. 35:5-10). These people lived some 900 years B. C. They were related to Moses—not Hebrews. They went with the Israelites into Canaan; they did not live in cities or houses, owned no real estate, but maintained the free nomadic life of the desert, and thus were not contaminated with city life. Their ancestor, Jonadab, exacted a promise from them to never touch wine—which promise they lived up to, in spite of all temptations. This tribe was used by Jeremiah as an example and an illustration for the Hebrew nation; saying that these Recheabites obeyed their father for generations, and the Jews, who enjoyed the protection and guiding hand of God would not listen to Him, but by disobedience and excesses in drunkenness brought the wrath of God upon them; whereas these Recheabites were promised a great reward for their faithfulness to their father.

The lesson is obvious. A drinking nation cannot be prosperous, neither can the individual, and society has also to suffer the consequences.

These people simply refused to touch the wine offered them by Jeremiah. This was not intended as a temptation; it was done in order to give them the opportunity to refuse, and thus prepare the way for the message which is embodied in this chapter, that men are more loyal to the commandments of men than to the commandments of God.

2—The life a Christian should live in evil days. The walk of man means his conduct and behavior. Carefulness is enjoined, which he cannot exercise if he should be an intemperate man, who acts foolish. For instance, if a business man spends more month after month than his income his business is doomed to bankruptcy; and if he should then buy a big building which he does not need, and acquire expensive machinery, which he cannot afford, he is put down as a foolish man. Man is expected to use

good sense, avoid all excesses. The Christian should in all things ascertain the will of God, before acting, to avoid much trouble. Redeeming the time means to make good use of opportunities, as they present themselves. There is a time for everything—right and wrong. It has no reference to time of day, but to opportunities. "Now is the accepted time, now is the day of salvation." (II Cor. 6:2). Opportunities may come only once—miss that and it is forever to be regretted. Esau is an example; he regretted the day of salvation. (Heb. 12-17). We go through life but once; how careful a Christian ought to be not to miss his opportunities, and give no offense or be a stumbling block for some. The Christian is admonished not to be full of wine, but filled with the spirit.

In the early church we read that the 120 at Pentecost were all filled with the Holy Ghost; so were Peter and John; so was Paul—then they were in their element, and something happened in their preaching and their acts. Spirit-filled people will accomplish something for God—but empty heads and hearts are only sounding brass—that is, a big noise.

3—A picture of an ideal Christian home. The ideal home presupposes father, mother and children—there is no home where there are no children. To establish that means that the parents are God-fearing and are guided by lofty and high ideals that conform to the Jesus way of living, that is to do the will of God. (Ps. 40:8; Heb. 10:7). Such parents will live soberly, patiently, lovingly—imitating their heavenly father in teaching their children the way of life.

Where father and mother live in harmony, "subjecting one to the other in the fear of Christ," their children will be obedient to their parents... which is right. Children will honor and respect their parents. Are there such ideal Christian homes? Is it expecting too much of our age? Yes, there are such homes, and we are not asking too much of our present generation. The children of such homes will not turn their parents over to public charity, social security or welfare organizations, but they share all with them. It is sure a blot on our advanced civilization that the state has to care for the aged, after having raised a family and given them a start in life, and then by thankless children being forsaken. The ideal Christian family does not produce such results.
