

Funeral of Veteran Railroad Man is Held

W. F. Brisse of Burlington, Ia., Laid to Rest Here—Was Missouri Pacific Employee Many Years.

This morning at 9:30 at the Sattler funeral home at Fourth and Vine streets, funeral services were held for William F. Brisse, 83, of Burlington, Iowa, a veteran employee of the Missouri Pacific railroad.

Mr. Brisse had not been ill long as he had been in very good health and just a short time ago had return-

ed to Burlington from a visit at Lincoln and here in Nebraska with relatives.

Mr. Brisse was a resident of Plattsmouth for a great many years and it was here that his family largely grew up, he coming here with the extension of the Missouri Pacific railroad from Union north to Omaha, and serving as the boss of the maintenance of ways workers of the railroad here for years.

In later years Mr. Brisse has made his home at Burlington Iowa, and where a year ago Mrs. Brisse passed away.
