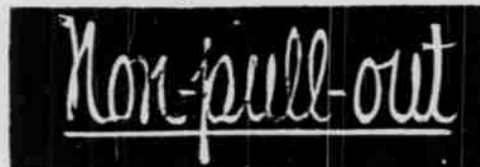

Chicago Times. To the Editor: Will you please inform me through the columns of your paper of the cause of the commercial crisis of 1893?
