#### School Board Meeting.

The board of education held an important session Monday night, a session chock full of business, chief of which was the seating of the newly elected members of the board, the election of its officers for the ensuing year, and the election of teachers from the lists recommended by Superintendent McHugh.

Prior to the swearing in of the new members, to whom the oath of office was administered by City Clerk Kelly Fox, R. B. Windham, the retiring president, spoke feelingly of the pleasant relations which had existed within the board as a whole during his term in office.

The election of the new officers resulted in the selection of John R. Cox for president, H. N. Dovey, vice president, and Clell Morgan secretary. Superintendent McHugh presented an exhaustive and thorough financial report compiled by himself with much care and painstaking, and covering a period of the past ten years, accounting for all receipts and expenditures within that time, and showing to the utter satisfaction of the board the exact financial condition of the school system at the present moment. It showed that by July 1, 1901, at the present rate of expenditure, the debt existing July 1, 1900, would be reduced \$500, and possibly \$1,000, at the same time keeping up the interest and taking care of more pupils than at any other time in the history of the schools.

A letter from the university of Nebraska complimented the board very highly upon the excellent standing of the Plattsmouth high school.
