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DEMAND FOR SAVINGS BANKS.

Postoffice Money Orders Purchased in Preference to Using Ordinary Banks.

In the office of the superintendent of the money order system of the general postoffice at Washington is evidence which will convince the most skeptical that there exists, especially in the west, a demand for a government institution where the savings of the people may be deposited.

The money order system was established for the accommodation of the people—those who do not enjoy bank accounts and cannot forward money by check.

When a money order is obtained by the payee beyond that period it can only be obtained by the superintendent of the system in Washington.

The use of the money order system as a savings bank is commencing to be frequently noted as at any time in the past. The mail being to the postoffice government daily numerous money orders to be secured.
