## PRINTERS' CONVENTION.

## New Arbitration Agreement Made With Publishers.

Now that the completed proceedings of the San Francisco convention of the International Typographlical union have been received it is possible to give a synopsis of the progress made in arblration.
The new arbitration agreement with the American Newspaper Publishers association provides that local boards be established to hear all disputes the boards to consist of five mem bers, two to be named by each side. and one of each side shall be "free from personal connection with or di rect interest in any newspaper or any labor union." These four shall elect a fifth member, who shall act as chair man and be a disinterested person Appeals may be taken from such loca boards to the national board of arbitratign. but no new. evidence shall be
heard A proposition to extend the agreement to cover the book and job branch of the trade was placed in the hands of the executive council to wor out.
