

An Appeal for Relief to the Alliances of Lancaster County.

BROTHERS AND SISTERS.—The failure of crops in the western and northwestern parts of the State has left many of our brothers and sisters destitute. So great is this destitution in many places that there is urgent and imperative need for immediate help.

An investigation has been made by a committee appointed by Gov. Thayer, consisting of State Agent J. W. Hartley and Rev. Mr. Martin. It appears by the report of this committee that there are many hundreds of families who are entirely destitute, having raised no crop whatever.

These people need grain, food, clothing, bedding—everything in fact that goes to make up the needs of daily life. Organized work is now going forward in the towns of the eastern part of the State to procure relief, in response to the Governor's appeal. It seems proper that the Alliance should also make an organized effort for the same purpose.

A depot for supplies has been opened in the Webster Block, on 11th street, Lincoln. All contributions delivered there before November 30th can be shipped free.

We now appeal to the Alliances of this county to organize for this relief work. Each Alliance should appoint a Relief Committee who should collect supplies of all kinds, and ascertain what future supplies can be secured.

Any Alliance having goods to ship soon can obtain shipping directions by applying to R. E. Randall, Shipping Agent for Lincoln.

Relief Committees should be able to report at the next meeting of the County Alliance, Dec. 6th, at 1 P. M., when a systematic system for securing relief can be arranged. O. HULL, Secretary.
