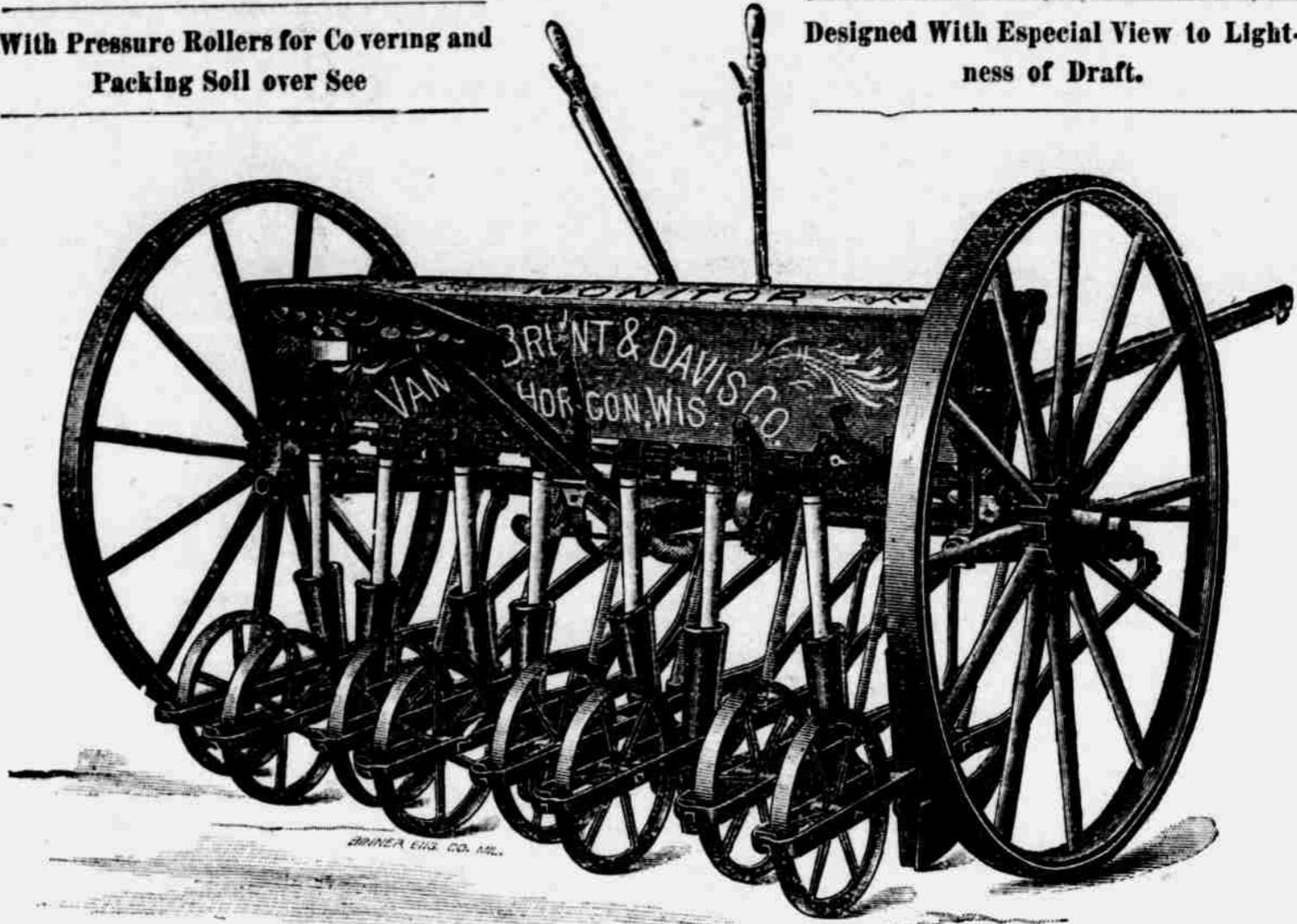

With Pressure Rollers for Covering and Packing Soil over See

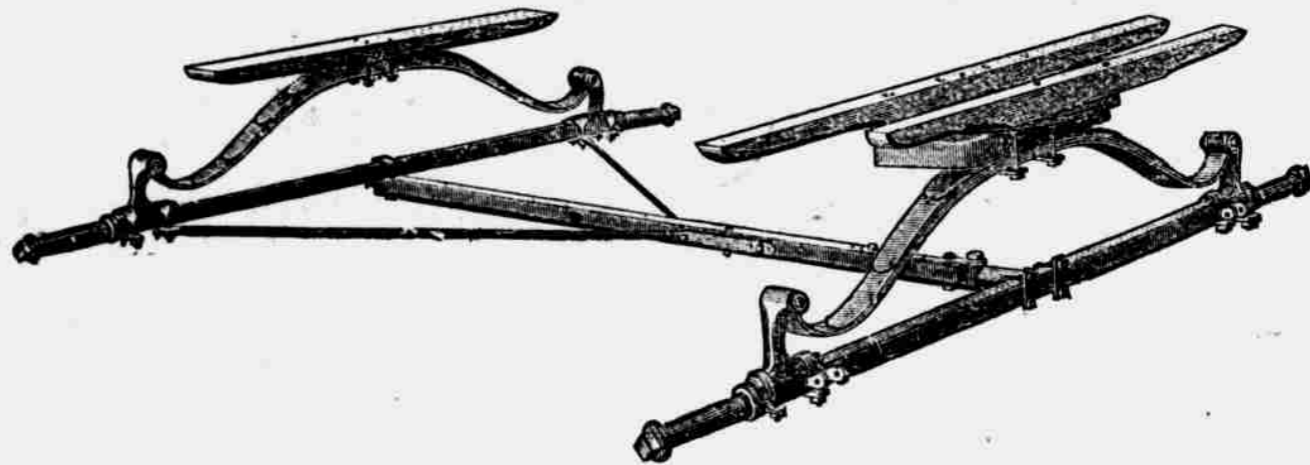
