Crouse Called Down.

BEATRICE, Sept. 16.

Editor of the ALLIANCE-INDEPENDENT Lincoln, Neb.

Dear Sir: In reading the Daily Nebraska State Journal of this date, I see that Lorenzo Crouse made a speech at Clay Center, Neb., yesterday in which he used the following language: "The second speaker introduced was Lorenzo Crouse, who was greeted with cheers. He responded briefly, speaking first of the prosperity of our own state, and the magnificent exhibits of Clay county. He was glad that for a quarter of a century his life had been spent in this state. Speaking of the advancement of the state and nation he said: 'Republicanism goes hand in hand with prosperity.' An object lesson in the form of fifty bills of defunct banks, of the wildcat system, pasted on a piece of muslin, was given and created applause. 'That,' said he, 'is the system our alliance friends want to back to.'"
