Rome the Enemy of Education.

The following statistics from the report of the minister of public education in Belgium are more that interesting-they are decidedly instructive. In 1884 there were closed in Belgium, 192 kindergartens, 1,247 private schools, and 15 trades schools: 305 public schools were abolished; 1,168 teachers were discharged, without any reason given; 1,500 teachers were put on half pay, and 3,300 teachers were put on the "retiring" list. In December, 1884. there were left but ten public schools. Such was the record of the Catholic, the state church party. Then matters came to a change. The liberal party came into power, the anti-clericals organized, and the result is that now there are 1,647 public schools, 370 parochial schools, and 38 free normal schools. In 1884 the cost to the state of each pupil was 55 francs; now it is but 31 francs,-Exchange.
