church and should not be subject to the evil power. One of the cardinals of the Catholic church says "It is better that the children should grow up in ignorance than to be educated in schools which are as reported in the state of Massachusetts; that the essential part of education is the catechism, that reading, writing and other studies are not essential to education."

But who are these people who would overthrow our public school system because it is immoral? They are, for the most part, of foreign birth subject to a foreign hierarchy, under the control, ready to march and to act at the command of this hierarchy.

In New York City 75 to 80 per cent. of all the criminals are Roman Catholics, educated in Roman Catholic parochial schools. And the same thing is true throughout the land, that 75 per cent. of all the criminals have been educated in parochial schools.

Now something with regard to the character of the teaching. Many people are ignorant of the character of the teaching in the parochial schools. You remember the quotation I read a few moments ago about the bishop insisting that the principle thing in education was the catechism, and that arithmetic, grammar, geography, reading, writing and spelling, while they are helpful, they are not essential to education?

They forget all about the real spirit of Lafayette, who was the leader of this help which came to us from France. Here is a question which I do not believe any of you can answer, as it is answered here: "Q. What was the first settlement in the New England States? A. A Jesuit mission on Mount Desert Island, in 1612." (Applause.)

Roman Catholics would oppose and reject the constitution. Nevertheless, they put in a certain article which reads like this: "Provision shall be made by law for a uniform system of public schools which shall be open for the education of the children in the state and free from sectarian or church control, and no other or different schools shall receive any aid from public funds; no church doctrine shall be taught in the schools."

You may know there was a law passed in Wisconsin, the Bennett law, which made this provision, that every school that was regarded as a school should teach for twelve weeks during the year in English, and that every child who went to school should spend twelve weeks in the study of English; should study reading, writing, arithmetic and spelling in the English language.

But someone will say the attitude of the Roman Catholic church has changed in the last few months on the school question. Has not Satoll given out these other instructions that Roman Catholics shall be unremitting in their efforts to have Catholic teachers in the public schools, to have Catholic members on the school boards.

Now, how may we protect these schools? I think we ought to follow the recommendation given by General Grant who said, "I most earnestly recommend that a constitutional amendment be submitted to the legislatures of the several states for ratification making it a duty for the several states to establish and forever maintain free public schools; forbid the teaching in said schools of religious, theistic or pagan tenets and prohibit the granting of any school funds or school taxes for the benefit of any religious sect or denomination."

This is the character of the teaching the Roman Catholics would have in our schools; in the schools of our city and of our country. You may know something of the contests which were waged in New Mexico, Illinois and in Wisconsin. I would like to tell you something about the position in New Mexico. They are overwhelmingly in the majority down there. Out of eight thousand who voted in four counties of New Mexico for schools, there were fifty-seven who voted in the affirmative. All the rest voted as the priests dictated, against the schools.

WORKMEN STRIKE AS A PROTEST AGAINST THE ADOPTION OF A CHARTER FOR THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA.

BOSTON, April 14.—The strike inaugurated by the labor leaders as a protest against the rejection by the chamber of deputies of the universal suffrage bill, is still spreading in the vicinity of Mass., the capital of the province of Hainaut, which is always prominent in labor disturbances, 15,000 men are on a strike. Fifteen unions and two factories in the central district are idle.

A thousand rioters crowded the lower part of the city and smashed in the windows of many cafes and shops as they marched along.

In the Place De La Monnaie, the police charged the rioters with drawn sabers, and dispersed them. Several persons were severely injured. Many arrests were made.

Among the arrests made are the socialist leaders Volders, Vanderveld and Maes. They were arrested while meeting the rioters to further violence. It is reported that anarchists distributed cartridges among the crowd.

The civil guards were called out and held in readiness for any emergency.

Farmer Assassinated.—ST. JOSEPH, Mo., April 14.—Monday William Snead and Lum Hayes his brother-in-law, prominent farmers residing a short distance from this city returned from Kansas. Hayes entered into negotiations with Thomas Tuck, for his farm. Snead told Tuck that Hayes would pay him in counterfeit money. Thursday night while the two men were talking in Tuck's house some one called to Snead, who slipped outside. As he did so he was shot five times, being instantly killed.

Freight Train Wrecked.—SALIDA, Colo., April 14.—A freight train was wrecked on the Rio Grande about four miles below Howard station, or about 19 miles from here, injuring a brakeman and two tramps. The injured brakeman was brought to the Salida hospital and will recover. Twenty-two cars were wrecked. The wreck was caused by the train breaking in two.

Hit in the Chess Match.—KOKOMO, Ind., April 14.—An unexpected hitch in the financial arrangements blocked the opening game of the chess match between Lasker and Showalter for the championship. The stakes are to be changed.

All Remain Out.—RATAN, N. M., April 14.—Not one of the 150 machinists, boilermakers and blacksmiths employed by the Santa Fe here has returned to work. Trouble will follow the introduction of non-union men.
