For fourteen years Mrs. Mary D. Bradford, one of the finest of teachers and a lady of exceptional literary and scholarly accomplishment, has labored in the public schools of this city, giving eminent satisfaction to the people and the school board and endearing herself to her every pupil.

Miss Bond has spent five, Miss Wallis six, Miss Mitchell five and Miss Tarbell three years in our schools and are known to be efficient teachers, yet each of these ladies has in some way incurred the great man's displeasure, which displeasure he takes every occasion to emphasize in ways peculiar to himself.

When the time comes specific charges will be made and can be substantiated proving the present principal of our schools eminently unfit for the place he occupies.—Kenosha Blade.

In his lecture in Exposition Building, May 26th, Father Sherman said, "The first principle of Americanism is liberty, especially religious liberty." Well, that is true, and it is untrue. It is true so long as men worship God according to the dictates of their own conscience, but it is untrue when men worship God according to the dictates of the pope.

WANT SATOLLI TO LEAVE.

Duluth People Adopt Resolutions Denouncing the Papal Ablegate.

DULUTH, Minn., June 25.—At the conclusion of a lecture delivered at the Lyceum theatre last evening by Prof. Walter Sims, to more than 2,000 people several hundred others being unable to obtain admittance, the following preamble and resolutions were unanimously adopted:

Whereas, Monsignor Satolli, an Italian minion of the pope, is roaming over the country plotting treason against our common school system of education, which is purely an American system and part and parcel of our government, because supported by taxation, one of the sovereign powers of government; therefore be it

Resolved, By the people of Duluth, in mass meeting assembled, that Satolli's presence in the country is a menace to our liberties and is obnoxious to all good Americans who love their country; and

Resolved, That he be requested to depart from this country at once, never to return.
