When Zedekiah, the last king of the house of Judah, was taken captive by Nebuchadnezzar about 588 years B. C., and carried to Babylon, where he died, Jeremiah, the prophet, escaped into Egypt with the daughters of Zedekiah, the ark of the covenant, Jacob's pillow, etc. Arriving in Egypt, the king assigned them a palace in Taphnes. It was called the Palace of the Jew's daughter, and a few years ago this same palace was unearthed by the exaccount of the death of Jeremiah in the Bible. He disappears from Egypt.

Some twenty Irish historians say that about the year 585 B. C., a strange man, callen by the historians Ollam Folia, landed in Ulster, having with him a princess whose name was Tea Tephi, which means the beautiful one from the east. The princess was married to Eciacaid, the governor of Ulster, who agreed to abandon Baal worship and to change the name of his palace from Lothair Croffin to Tara, and to be crowned on the wonderful stone, Lia Fail, which means stone of destiny. He then assumed the name of Heremon of Tara.

On this Lia Fail were crowned all the kings of Ireland from Heremon to Earcan; the kings of Argyleshire from Feargus Moon to Ali in; the kings and queens of Scotland from Kenneth to Mary, and the sovereigns of Great Britain from James to Queen Victoria.


