AGAIN ON RECORD. Resolutions Adopted by the Baptist General Association of Missouri.

LOUISIANA, Mo., Oct. 27.—The Baptist General Association of Missouri, which has just completed its sixteenth annual meeting, adopted the following resolutions:

Whereas, The constitution of the United States of America guarantees civil and religious liberty to our people, we look with apprehension on any encroachments on these rights by legislative caprice.

Resolved, That we, representing 125,000 Baptists, meeting in the General Association of Missouri, hereby deplore those legislative and executive acts by which the public revenue and honor of the country have been invaded.

Resolved, That a copy of these resolutions be forwarded to each of Missouri's senators and representatives in congress, to the secretary of the interior, and to the commissioner of Indian affairs.

SHOULD BE ADOPTED.

Amendments to the Constitution of New York That Americans Should Vote for.

Article IX. of the revised state constitution of New York, as submitted by the constitutional convention, is as follows:

Section 1. The legislature shall provide for the maintenance and support of a system of free common schools, wherein all the children of this state may be educated.
