LOUISIANA, Mo., Oct. 27 .- The Baptist General Association of Missouri, which has just completed its sixteenth annual meeting, adopted the following resolutions:

Whereas, The constitution of the United States of America guarantees civil and religious liberty to our people, croachments on these rights by legislative caprice. For nearly a decade we have witnessed with increasing alarm the appropriations from the public treasury of money in aid of religious organizations. Contrary to the constitution, and inimical to public policy, we have seen the halls of congress deseand the service of the government placed at the disposal of ecclesiastical functionaries, thereby provoking re-ligious controversy and corruption; therefore, be it

Resolved, That we, representing 125,-000 Baptists, meeting in the General Association of Missouri, hereby deplore which the public revenue and honor of the country have been invaded.
