"I.elect of the - diocese, from henceforward will be sious Prince Constantine, and that as god he faithful and obedient to St. Peter the Apostle and to the Holy Roman church, and to our lord, the holy pope of Rome, and to his successors, canonically entering, I will neither 11. #### Priest's Oath.

-, now in the presence of Almighty God, the blessed Virgin Mary, the clessed Michael the Archangel, the blossed t. John the Baptist, the Holy Apostles St. Peter and St. Paul and the Saints and the lacred Hosts of Heaven, and to you, my lord, do declare from my heart, without mental reservation that the pope is Christ's vicargeneral and is the true and only head of the universal church throughout the earth, and bat, by virtue of the keys of binding and cosing given to his holiness by Jesus Christ e has power to depose heretical kings, princes, states, commonwealths and governnents, all being illegal without his sacred onfirmation, and that they may safely by destroyed. Therefore to the utmost of my power, I will defend this doctrine and his oliness' rights and customs against all surpers of the Protestant authority whatsoever, especially against the now pretended authority and church in England and all adherents, in regard that they be usurpal and heretical, opposing the sacred mother of the church of Rome.

"I do denounce and disown any allegiance as due to any Protestant king, prince or tate or obedience to any of their inferior officers. I do further declare the doctrine of the church of England, of the Calvinists, Huguenots and other Protestants, to be samnable and those to be damned who will ot forsake the same.

"I do further declare that I will help, assist and advise all or any of his holiness' agents any plact wherever I shall be, and to do y utmost to extirpate the Protestant docine and to destroy all their pretended lower, regal or otherwise. I do further promse and declare that, notwithstanding I may

be permitted by dispensation to assume any estical religion (Protestant denominations) or the propagation of the mother church's terest, to keep secret and private all her gents' counsels as they entrust me, and not divulge, directly or indirectly, by word, criting or circumstances whatsoever, but to recute all which shall be proposed, given in charge or discovered unto me by you, my ost reverend lord and bishop.

"All of which I, \_\_\_\_\_, do swear by the lessed Trinity and blessed Sacrament which I am about to receive, to perform on my part to keep inviolably, and do call on ii the Heavenly and Glorious Host of Heaven to witness my real intentions to keep this my oath.

"In testimony whereof I take this most holy and blessed Sacrament of the Eucharist, and witness the same further with my consecrated hand, in the presence of my holy bishop and all the priests who assist him in my ordination to the priesthood."

I will defend this doctrine and his holiness' right and custom against all usurpers of the heretical or Protestant authority whatsoever, e- ecially the Lutheran church of Germany, Holland, Denmark, Sweden and Norway, and the now pretended authorities and churches of England and Scotland, and branches of the same now established in Ireland, and on the continent of America, and elsewhere, and all adherents in regard that they be usurped and heretical,

opposing the sacred church of Rome. rdo now denounce and disown any allegarce as due to any heretical king, prince or state named Protestant or Liberals or obedience to any of their laws, magistrates

or officers. I do further declare that the doctrine of the churches of England and Scotland, of the Calvinists, Huguenots and others of the name of Protestant or Liberals, to be dameable, and they themselves to be damned

who will not fersake the same.

I do further decla e that I will help, assist and advise all or any of his holiness' agents, in any place wherever I shall be, in Switzerland, Germany, Holland, Denmark, Sweden, Notway, England, Iceland or America, or in always. any other kingdom or territory, I shall come to, and do my utmost to extirpate the heretical Protestant or Liberal doctrines, and to destroy all their pretended powers, legal or

I do further promise and declare that, notwithstanding I am dispensed with to assume any religion heretical for the propagation of the mother church's interest, to keep secret and private all her agents' councils from time to time, as they entrust me, and not to divulge, directly or indirectly, by word, writing or circumstances whatever, but to execute all that shall be proposed, given in charge, or discovered unto me, by you or my ghostly father, or any of this sacred con-

I do further promise and declare that I will have no opinion or will of my own or any other nauescating or injurious drugs. mental reservation whatsoever, even as a corpse or cadaver (perinde ac cadaver), but will unhesitatingly obey each and every command that I may receive from my superlors in the milit a of the pope and of Jesus Christ.

That I will go to any part of the world whithersoever I may be sent, to the frozen regions of the north, the burning sands of the desert of Africa, or the pingles of India. to the centers of civilization of Europe, or to the wild haunts of the barbarous savages of America, without murmuring or repining and will be submissive in all things whatsoever, communicated to me.

I do furthermore promise and declare that I will, when opportunity presents, make and wage relentless war, secretly or openly, against all heretics, Protestants and Liberals as I am directed to do, to extirpate them from the face of the whole earth, and that I will spare neither age, sex or condition, and that I will hang, burn, waste, boll, flay, strangle and bury alive these infumous heretics; rip up the stomachs and wombs of their women and crush their infants' heads against the walls in order to annihilate their

I will secretly use the pois onous cup, the strangulating cord, the steal of the poinard, or the leaden bullet, regardless of the honor, rank, dignity or authority of the person or persons, whatever may be their condition in life, either public or private, as I at any time may be directed so te do by any agent of the pope or superior of the brotherhood of the boly father, of the society of Jesus.

In confirmation of which I hereby dedicate my life, my soul and all corporal powers, and with this dagger which I now receive, I will subscribe my name, written in my bloed, in testimony thereof; and should I prove falss or weaken in my determination, may my brethren and fellow soldiers of the militia of the pope cut off my hands and my feet, and my throat from ear to ear, my belly opened and sulphur burned therein, with all the punishment that can be inflicted upon me or eart, and my soul be tortured by demons in an etermal hell forever.

All of which L ..... the blessed trinity, and blessed sucrawers which I am now to receive, to perform, and on my part to keep inviolably; and do call all the heavenly and giorious host of heaves to witness these, my real lutentions, to keep this my oath.

In testimony hereof I take this most holy and blessed sacrament of the eucharist, and witness the same further, with my name written with the point of this dagger, dipped in my own blood, and seal in the face of this (He receives the wafer from the superior and writes his name with the point of his dagger, dipped in his own blood, taken from over the heart.) holy convent

#### The Fenian's Oath.

I swear by almighty God, by all in heaven and earth, by the holy prayer-book of my holy church, by the blessed Virgin Mary mother of God, by her sorrow and grief at the cross, by her tears and wallings, by the boly apostles St. Peter and Paul, by the glorious apostle of Ireland-St. Patrick-by the blessed and holy church of all ages, by the holy national martyrs, to fight upon the Irish soil, to fight for the independence of reland-to fight until I die, wading in the red gore of the Sassenach (Protestant) for the glorious cause of nationality; to fight until not a single vestige, track or footstep, is left to tell that the holy soil of Ireland was ever trodden by the Sassenach tyrants and murderers; and, morover, when the Protestant robbers and orutes in Ireland like the swine our Lord Jesus Christ caused to be drowned, then we shall embark for, and take England, and root out every veslige of the accursed blood of the heretic adulterer, Henry VIII., and possess ourselves of the beasts who have so long keps our island of saints-Old Ireland-in the chains of bondage, driven us from her shores, exiles into foreign lands. #### Oath of the Clan-na-Gael.

The following is the oath taken by the members of that famous Romish Catholic society:

"I (name in full) do solemnly swear in tha presence of Almighty God, that I will labou fend a republican form of government in Ireland: that I will keep secret the names and everything connected with the Irish brotherhood from all not entitled to know such secrets; that I will obey and comply with the constitution and laws of the same

That I will preserve the funds of this order for the cause of Irish revolution alone as specified in the constitution; that I will deem it my special duty and mission to promote and foster sentiments of union, brotherly love, nationality, among ali Irish I take this obligation without any mental reservation, holding the same forever binding upon me, and that any violation thereof, or desertion of my duty to the brotherhood is infamous, and merits the severest punishment, so help me God."

This oath the candidate is abjured to keep at the hazzard of his life. It was printed in the Chicago Inter Ocean and was sworn to be correct at the Cronin trial. It was reported by said paper November 17, 1894. Priests and bishops act as chaplains for this holy (?) order.

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
