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

Its Action on the Muscles More Intens Than the Continuous.

THE ALTERNATING CURRENT.

Some German experiments conducted to ascertain the effects of alternating currents on the human body were made as follows. Two metallic conductors of opposite polarity were held, one in each hand. With the hands damp and effective electromotive force of thirty volte at fifty alternations per second the whole arm seemed paralyzed; extended it could not be flexed, and flexed it could not be strengthened. At the same time the pain was so severe it could not be borne for more than five of six seconds, and it was with difficulty that the hands could be detached from the electrodes. When the voltage was raised to fifty volts complete fixation occurred, that is, the hands could not be withdrawn by voluntary effort, and the pain was intense. When the voltage was raised to eighty, even with the hands dry, all the above phenomena was accentuated. The effects of alternating currents on the muscles and organs of the body is much more intense than continuous currents of the same voltage. Experiments were also conducted to observe the effects of the current passing to the earth through the body from a live wire. A person standing on a damp macadamized road with dry shoes and touching his hand to a conductor having a potential of 1,000 volts, experienced a burning sensation, and when the conductor was grasped by the whole hand a violent tremor occurred through the body, with complete fixation. Such experiments are exceedfigly dangerous and might prove fatal, and, Insequently should not be attempted except under special conditions, of which an expert only should be the judge.




