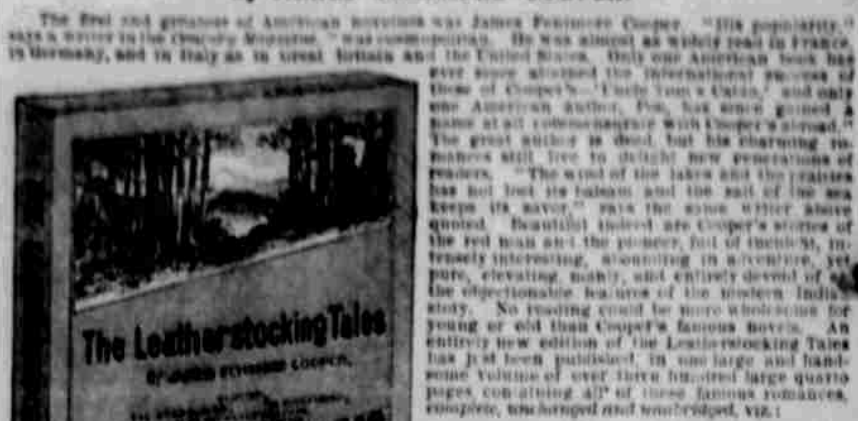

SHOT DOWN BY THE WHITES.

North Carolina Whites Made Good Their Threats.

WREAK THEIR VENGEANCE.

A Negro Editor's Newspaper Front and Building Destroyed by Citizens Led by an Ex-Congressman—The Town Armed for the Clash.

WILMINGTON, N. C., Nov. 11.—This morning the white people made good their threats to take vengeance on the negro newspaper which published the editorial derogatory to white women.

At half past 7 o'clock, the negroes not having responded to the demand for the removal of the press of the Record, the negro newspaper, ex-Representative Waddell, the chairman of the white committee of twenty-five, repaired to the Light Infantry armory.

When the crowd arrived in front of the Record office, a two-story frame building, picket lines were thrown out across the streets and squads of men posted in the neighborhood.

There was no response and the door was soon burst open. The citizens rushed into the place and began the work of destruction.

After destroying the printing house, the marchers returned to the armory, where they had left a rapid-fire machine gun mounted in a wagon ready to be dispatched to the scene if a battle should occur.

Between 1 and 2 o'clock there were several skirmishes. The total casualties at 8 o'clock were eight negroes killed, two wounded and three white men wounded—Mayo, Chadwick and Finer.

PANA ON EDGE FOR A RIOT.

Citizens Fear That Every Negro and Operator Will Be Killed.

PANA, Ill., Nov. 11.—William Lynch, who was employed by the Pana Coal company up to the time of the strike, was shot at by negroes last night, and ran into his house.

Things are in such a state that it is dangerous for any one to go out in the mining district at night. The citizens fear an outbreak in which every negro and operator will be killed.

TROOPERS SAIL FOR PORTO RICO.

SAVANNAH, Ga., Nov. 11.—The United States transport Michigan sailed with six troops of the Fifth United States cavalry, under command of Colonel C. C. Carr, for Porto Rico, yesterday. She carried about 900 horses and 545 men.

TOWNS NOT DEFEATED YET.

DELUTH, Minn., Nov. 11.—Latest returns and estimates have caused the Republican congressional committee of the Sixth district to reduce their estimate of Morris's majority to 123. The Democratic committee now claim Towne's election by about 150. Several precincts are missing and the result is very much in doubt.

CIVIL WAR THREATENS SPAIN.

Three Frontiers Almost Ready to Rebel Talk of a Dictatorship.

LONDON, Nov. 11.—The Paris correspondent of the London Daily Telegraph says: "There is much anxiety to government circles here as to the Spanish situation. This is not because there is any fear that peace will not be concluded, for it is held that Spain and the United States are bound to agree sooner or later, though now it is said that Spain wants \$120,000,000 for the Philippines, while the United States considers \$50,000,000 ample."

"It is the Spanish domestic situation that inspires alarm. Senor Sagasta's government is tottering. Anarchy, civil war and military dictatorship are candidates for the succession to parliamentary government. Meanwhile Catalonia and two other provinces are loudly demanding separation. France views the situation with apprehension and even with alarm."

HOW NEW YORK DIVIDED.

Roosevelt Had a Majority of 107,736 Outside of the City.

NEW YORK, Nov. 11.—Corrected returns show that Roosevelt's plurality all outside of Greater New York is 107,736. Van Wyck's plurality in Albany, Chemung, Clinton, Erie, Rensselaer and Schoharie counties and Greater New York is 86,490. Roosevelt's plurality, 21,246.

The falling off in Roosevelt's plurality as compared with Black's in 1896 is due to a decrease in the Republican vote up the state of 61,000 and in Greater New York of 62,000. Against this Van Wyck gained 39,000 above the Harlem and 53,000 below it as compared with Porter two years ago. The result on congressman in this state seems to have surprised even the Democrats themselves.

THE BUFFALO BACK TO REPAIR.

A Board of Inquiry Will Fix the Blame—To Sail Again for Manila.

WASHINGTON, Nov. 11.—The cruiser Buffalo, which sailed Saturday from Sandy Hook, bound for Manila, to join Admiral Dewey's squadron, put in at Newport, R. I., yesterday, with machinery broken. Captain Hemphill, commanding the ship, reported to the department by telegraph that he had been obliged to seek a shore station to repair. He asked for an investigation to fix the responsibility for the break, and Secretary Long responded immediately by appointing Commander John Mcgowan, superintendent of the training station; Commander C. H. Stockton, president of the war college, and Chief Engineer R. S. Griffin of the Mayflower, a court of inquiry, with Lieutenant W. I. Chambers as judge advocate. The court of inquiry will meet to-morrow at Newport.

A COMET WITH TWO TAILS.

Dr. Lewis Swift Notices Many Peculiar Things About a New Celestial Body.

PARADISE, Cal., Nov. 11.—Dr. Lewis Swift, director of Mount Lowe observatory, has been studying the comet discovered recently by Dr. William R. Brooke. One peculiarity of it is a broad and exceedingly faint tail, pointing toward instead of from the sun, as usual. At one of his observations the professor is confident that he saw two tails. He believes the visitor is identical with comet No. 4 of 1881. He says it can be easily seen through a 2-inch telescope near the Delta Hercules.

QUAY LOST SIX CONGRESSMEN.

PHILADELPHIA, Nov. 11.—The delegation from Pennsylvania in the next Congress will comprise twenty-one Republicans and nine Democrats, a Democratic gain of six. The present delegation is composed of twenty-seven Republicans and three Democrats. The successful Democrats in the new Democratic districts are: Laird H. Barber, Stanley W. Davenport, James W. Ryan, Rufus K. Polk, Joe C. Sibley and James K. P. Hall. In each of these districts except the Seventeenth the present Republican representative was a candidate for re-election. William McAleer, who was re-elected from the Third district, is a sound money Democrat and the Republicans made no nomination against him.

MANY SOLDIERS ILL IN HAWAII.

In Two Months Fifteen Deaths Are Reported—Typhoid Fever Prevalent.

SAN FRANCISCO, Nov. 11.—The steamer Australia brings the following advice from Honolulu under the date of November 3. Sickness among the soldiers in camp here is increasing. Typhoid fever is prevalent. The military hospital is crowded and the nursing force is inadequate to the demands made upon it.

FRANCE MAY DRAFT RESERVE SHIPS.

PARIS, Nov. 11.—The Paris Matin says that at a council of the admirals here yesterday it was decided to fit out all of the French war vessels available and to order thirty reserve ships into commission. The newspapers of this city, notably the Gaulois and the Figaro, express satisfaction at the Marquis of Salisbury's speech, delivered at the Guild hall banquet last night, which they consider as tending toward a peaceful solution by replacing the Fashoda question on its proper ground.
