Ex-Governor John A. Martin, of Kansas, died at his home in Atchison last week. He had long been identified with the republican party of Kansas and was editor and proprietor of the Atchison Champion. He was buried by his comrades of the G. A. R.

A prohibitory liquor amendment was added to the constitution of both North and South Dakota by a majority vote of the people at the recent election. This result had been conceded to South Lakota but was an astonishing surprise to the people of North Dakota.

From recent estimates Iowa is placed first in the production of corn this season. Missouri ranks second, Kansas third, and Illinois fourth. The aggregate yield of the four states is put at 1,141,000,000 bushels-more than one half of the total product of the United States.

Cass county has gone into the investigating business and already a shortage of several hundred dollars has been found in the accounts of two of the officials. The records are thought to be badly out of kelter clear back to the county's organization.

Many of the large manufacturing establishments in Wheeling have been obliged to return to the use of coal for heating purposes on account of the failure in the supply of natural gas. It is very evident that the supposed "unlimited supply" is fast giving out in Pennsylvania and in order to try and make up for this deficiency another and most thorough test is contemplated in both old and new localities. Should the Pennsylvania supply continue to decrease and the Wyoming supply be developed and increased, what would be the result to Sioux county. Reader you may easily surmise.
