Republican County Convention.

The republican election of Sioux County, Neb., are requested to send delegates from their several precincts to meet in convention in Harrison, Neb., on Saturday, June 25, at 11 o'clock, a.m. For the purpose of choosing two delegates to the republican state convention to be held at Lincoln, on Wednesday, July 1, 2 delegates to the 6th congressional district convention to be held at North Platte, on Friday, July 6, two delegates to the 11th senatorial district convention, and two delegates to the 3d representative district convention, and the transaction of such other business as may properly come before the convention.

THE APPOINTMENT.

The several precincts are entitled to representatives as follows, being based upon the vote cast for Hon. T. L. Norval, for supreme judge in 1885, giving one delegate at large for each precinct and one delegate for each ten votes or major fraction thereof:

Congressman Mercer succeeded in getting Kem out of the way long enough to allow the passage of the bill for the Omaha exposition, and now it becomes a law. All Nebraska takes off its hat to Mercer, and extends the toe of its boot to Kem.

The latest reports from the national republican convention at St. Louis are that no nominations have been made. Gen. Fairbanks was made temporary chairman and Senator Thurston permanent chairman. The free silver plank was defeated. A test vote showed McKinley to have nearly six hundred votes, but the vice-president is still in doubt.

Now that it is known that Kem will not attempt to hold his job any longer a number of pops have indicated that they would like to play statesman at \$5,000 a year. H. G. Stewart has been traveling over the district exhibiting his whiskers and lung power with a view to getting the nomination. But he is not the only pop in the northwest who has his eye on Kem's seat and salary. E. L. Heath, of Rushville, has been sawing a little wood and may make a little rough place in Stewart's path. It may furnish them some amusement but the next representative from this district in congress will be a republican and his name will be M. P. Kinkaid.

First and foremost, the man who owes a newspaper an honest debt and will not pay it, can be counted as an enemy. The man who wants an office, and complains because the newspaper will not champion him in preference to all others is pretty apt to become an enemy. The man who wants to dictate to a paper, and is not allowed to do so, is a sure enemy. The ruffian and the bully never like a bold and fearless newspaper. The sneak and the coward fear newspapers, and consequently do not like them. But of all men that a newspaper should dislike, it is the man whom it has befriended and assisted, and who proves the ingrate—who turns his back on the paper after securing all from it possible. The indications seem to be that George A. Eckles, of Chadron, will be nominated for auditor at the republican state convention. His claims are based on the fact that this part of the state has never been allowed a representative and it is no more than just that a candidate from the northwest part of the state be given a place on the ticket. In the event of his nomination Mr. Eckles will put up a campaign in this district and the state of a kind to add strength to the entire ticket and will help to get the 6th congressional district into the republican column. It is not always good politics for the big cities and populous counties to take everything in sight all the time. There are a great many republicans in the northwest who have worked hard for years in the interests of the party and the recognition of a northwestern man would make them take hold with renewed vigor. The republican party cannot afford to neglect any opportunity to strengthen its lines, and the nomination of Eckles would prove an element of strength.

A man in Dawes county, was arrested last week and taken to Omaha and arraigned in the federal court on an indictment returned by the grand jury charging him with having fenced in some government land. He was fined \$1 and costs and ordered to remove the fence. This is the only case of the kind which the writer can recall, and it looks as if it was straining the law a point. There are thousands of acres of government land under fence, as it has always been the rule in new counties, as it enables the adjoining settler to get some additional pasture, otherwise the grass would go to waste and if the federal grand jury were to indict all who have fenced in a little of Uncle Sam's domain there are but few who will not be liable to be caught in the dragnet among those who are engaged in the stock business in this country. If a fence on government land interferes with the rights or conveniences of the public it should be removed, but the journal believes that to indict a man and take him off to Omaha without so much as notice or demand to remove his fence is carrying the matter too far.
