Think nothing of me; take no thought for the political fate of any man whomsoever; but come back to the truths that are in the Declaration of Independence."

SHOULD APPLY TO-DAY. How forcibly should this appeal of Lincoln's come to those who are to day making war upon a people who were our allies against our common enemy, and who would still be our friends, if we would but assure them that they should have the right of self government.

Like the United States government has done in the Phillipine Islands, the English government are pouncing on the Transvaal republic in South Africa, without even declaring war, simply because the Boers will not let them rob them of their property rights and independence. How president McKinley could be induced to use the good offices of the United States to bring about peace between England and the Transvaal republic and be content is beyond our reasoning powers, while we as a nation are engaged in the same business.
