

Bussia's Liberalism.

It seems that some of the reports oncerning the growing liberalism of Russian edministration in Polance must be received with a good deal of caution. Last autumn there was published in the newspapers of Southern Rossia what purported to be an officia program respecting the privileges that the Polish educational institutions were to be granted in the teach ing and speaking of the Polish language in Russian Poland. This was the occasion of much rejoicing and of much commendation of the Russian government for its generous treat-ment of the Poles. These congratulations seem to have been premature. for recent reports say that two of the most prominent philanthropists at Warsaw have been deprived of their title of excellency and otherwise punished for permitting the use of and teaching the Polish language in some educational institutions under their honorary jurisdiction. The Polisi books and manuals used in these places have been confiscated and it is understood that severe measures will be taken for the prevention of such unlawful acts in the future. This in telligence has been received with great sadness and discouragement by many Polish communities ir outhern Russia.


