To George D. Canon, non-resident
defendant: You are hereby notified, that
on the 26, day of September, A. D. 1902,
W. Chauncy Phipps and George A.
Phipps, as plaintiffs, filed in the district
court of Sioux county, Nebraska, their
petition against you as defendant, the
object and prayer of which is for a decre-
satisfying and discharging two certain
mortgages executed by them to you on
the 15th day of July, A. D. 1901, secur-
ing the payment of two notes of that
date executed by them to you, one for
\$200.00 due in six months and one for
\$500.00 due in one year, both of which
notes having been fully paid, one of said
mortgages being on the plant of the
Harrison Press Journal, a news paper of



STOCK REPORT.

South Omaha, Neb. Nov. 5, 1902.
Last week brought over 35,000 cattle
and a stronger market, being 20 to 25c
higher in some cases. This week opens
with fair receipts and a steady market,
but bulk of receipts are of poor quality.
Good cattle are in strong demand.
We quote cured beef 5.00 to 7.00;
best grass beef and box beef 4.75 to 5.25;
choice light feeders 4.25 to 4.50, good
fair feeders 3.50 to 4.00, common 2.50 to
3.25; choice fat grass cows 3.25 to 3.75,
good 2.75 to 3.25, canners 1.50 to 2.50;
veal 4.00 to 6.00; hogs 2.00 to 4.00.
Good stock calves weighing 300 to 400
pounds, 4.25 to 5.00; heifers, 3.00 to 3.50.
Dog receipts continue light and market
continues to decline, but is steady today.
Range of prices 6.45 to 6.60.
This week starts with still another
high mark for a single day's receipts of
sheep, 38, and Tuesday brings 12,000.
Fat sheep firm; best feeders about
steady with last week's close, others
weak.
