In Saxony, of 994,699 school children, 137,581, or 23 per cent, are employed in trade. More than half these children are employed in the textile industry.

MEASURING THE AIR'S DUST.

Ingenious Apparatus Devised by a Noted German Scientist.

An ingenious apparatus for estimating the amount of dust in the air has just been devised by Karl Arenas. It consists of a glass tube loosely packed with cotton wool and connected with an aspirating apparatus on the principle of bellows, says an exchange.

After the tube and the wool have been perfectly dried they are weighed, and then a given volume of the air to be tested is drawn through, carrying with it its quota of dust and moisture.

The tube is then allowed to stand over strong sulphuric acid for twenty-four hours, or until the moisture is attracted from the wool. The tube and its contents are now weighed again, and the increase in weight represents the amount of dust in the given volume of air.

A great many experiments have been made with the new instrument, and among the results are the following, which show in milligrams the amount of dust per cubic meter found in the air in the places mentioned: Laboratory, 1.3; schoolroom, 10; hair factory, 17; saw factory, 17 and 15; woolen factory (picking-room), 7; woolen factory (cutting room), 20; flour mill, 22 and 28; iron foundry, (fifteen to twenty workmen), 23; iron foundry (not previously used), 1.5; iron foundry (few workmen), 12; iron foundry (during intervals), 8; stuff factory 72; stuff factory (before grinding), 18; cement works (during work), 24; cement works (in an interval), 150.
