TO ALL TO WHOM IT MAY CONCERN: The commissioner appointed to locate a road commencing at a point where county road No. 4 intersects the half section line running east and west through section 21, Twp 32, Range 42; thence east on or about 30 rods; thence east 20 rods; thence through in a south easterly direction, thence south west 40 rods; thence 30 rods west and connecting with said road No. 4 at a point on or about one-fourth of a mile from the point where it leaves said above mentioned half sec. line. Recommended that said road be allowed and also that the following described portion of county road No. 4 be vacated, that portion from the point where the proposed road connects with road No. 4 to the point it intersects road No. 4 as now established.
