

SUMMARY REPORTS FROM SCENE OF WAR.

Febr. 5—The Russian cruiser Boyarin, owing to a blunder of the navigator, has been blown up by a Russian land mine and 107 officers and men perished.

The two cruisers that Japan bought of Argentina have arrived safely at a Japanese port to be added to Japan's fighting navy.

The Japanese commercial agent, coming from Vladivostok, reports that the main Russian squadron there is free, but ten of the torpedo boats are fast in the ice.

The Japanese continue to be angered by confirmed reports of Russian cruelty to Japanese refugees leaving Manchuria.

The first trophy of the war to be presented to the emperor of Japan will be the flag of the Russian cruiser Varyag, sunk by the Japs at Chemulpo.

The greater part of the meat ordered by Russia from South Omaha and Kansas City has not reached its destination, and it is stated that it may be seized in passage by Japan.

Russia continues to mass troops on the north bank of the Yalu river.

Febr. 16—China may take hand in fight. Russia is ready for action in India.

Febr. 17—Japan lands one hundred and twenty thousand troops in Korea.
